WHY: On Oct. 27, 1986, Pope John Paul II realized a great dream: he invited representatives of world religions to Assisi, Italy, so that a single song of peace might be sent to the one God from many hearts and in many languages. Twenty six years later a message of peace is needed as much today as it was then, as is a commitment to build peace in this world. The theme of the prayer service is *Pilgrims of Truth*, *Pilgrims of Peace*, as all are called to walk the path of peace as pilgrims, to pray and fast for justice in the world, and to dialogue with one another in an effort to discover creative ways to build peace today.
