### The Gosnell Case is Not Atypical, by Alejandro Luciano

In recent weeks we have observed with horror the never-ending gruesome details of <u>what went on daily at</u> <u>Dr. Kermit Gosnell's abortion clinic in Philadelphia.</u> (links to story in *The Atlantic*, some disturbing images and graphic details are given). We shouldn't be amazed. The goal of abortion is the destruction of human life. The Gosnell case is an extreme but it is not atypical. Perhaps most abortion clinics are not as unsanitary or careless as Gosnell's, but the aim is the same. In the craze to normalize and justify abortion, all is sacrificed. If the child survives he or she gets the cold shoulder. This is not the delivery room, this is an abortuary. The aim is a dead baby, not a live child that needs to be cared for. The women are victims of their circumstances and many times are not aware of the real choices available to them.


It is very interesting for us here at the Office of Advocacy and Justice, that this case should come to national attention, notwithstanding apathy in some sectors of the media, just weeks after our visit to Tallahassee for <u>Catholic Days at the Capitol</u>. During that visit one of the bills we advocated for was <u>the Infants Born Alive Bill</u> <u>sponsored by Rep. Cary Pigman</u>. This bill seeks to provide guidelines for care of children that survive abortion. When advocating for this bill in front of our legislators some of the representatives "Have you not heard of the Philadelphia case?" The representative shook her head and looked even more puzzled. Well, I think she's heard about it now, and I'm proud to say that the bill is close to becoming law after <u>its unanimous passage in the Florida Senate on April 30th</u>. Legislative advocacy is powerful!

Our duties as Christians go far beyond the condemnation of abortion. We must teach the truth but we must also act. I urge our readers to learn about their <u>local crisis pregnancy centers</u>. Lives are saved every day at these centers and the women and men that volunteer to help are the unsung heroes of the Pro-Life Movement. Learn about the Gosnell case with this documentary, and never cease to pray for those suffering the effects of abortion.

## Execution Scheduled for May 29<sup>th</sup>

Elmer Leon Carroll is scheduled to be executed on Wednesday, May 29<sup>th</sup>. Please pray for Mr. Carroll, his family, the victim's family and friends, that they will continue to receive healing through the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ; for all the public officials involved in this scheduled execution; for Governor Scott, that he will discern God's will and apply the teachings of our Catholic faith on the death penalty. A vigil will be held at 5pm on May 29 at St. James Cathedral.

The bishops agreed the vigil should have a focus on "ending the use" of the death penalty and also prayers for the victims of the crime, their families and loved ones, and for the individual being executed. Vigils will rotate through the dioceses with the selected diocese for the service determined on a case by case basis. Join us for the first such vigil in our diocese.
