This will be the largest diaconal ordination class in the history of the Diocese of Orlando! This year we are pleased that there are no restrictions on attendance to this happy and sacred occasion. #### **PURIFICATION OF SACRED VESSELS AT MASS**

The Office of Permanent Deacons has been asked to provide a refresher course on purifying sacred vessels after Holy Communion. This has been requested because many times this process takes far too long to complete. While it will be difficult to gather all 234 of our deacons in one place for a training class, we'd like to share a few reminders.

Purification of sacred vessels may be performed by clergy or formally instituted acolytes. It may be done during Mass or immediately thereafter, if doing so during Mass would result in a significant delay. It may be done at the altar, at the credence table, or in the sacristy after Mass.

Except for flat patens which cannot contain water for rinsing, and, therefore, should have fragments wiped carefully into a chalice; all other vessels should be purified with a small amount of water that is swirled to ensure it collects any fragments of the Body of Christ or remaining Precious Blood. A single swirl around the vessel should be sufficient. The diluted contents of one vessel may be poured into another for its own purification. This allows the person purifying to consume liquid from the last cup purified. Drying of cups is not required, but may be completed by another assisting minister.

The purification of vessels should never draw disproportionate time or attention away from the Liturgy of the Eucharist or the Concluding Rites. Thank you for your increased focus on this in service.

The process to determine which men will be invited into the formal discernment year for the Permanent Diaconate as part of Cohort 2028 is approaching completion. Forty-eight men attended last fall's discernment nights. Pastors requested applications for forty of those men. Twenty-five applications were completed and reviewed by a seven-member admission team. Twenty interviews have been completed and recommendations to the Bishop will be made in May. Please pray for all applicants and the admissions team.
