DIOCESAN PROPERTIES DAMAGED AFTER IAN

As Little Lake Fairview rose behind Bishop Moore Catholic High School, it overflowed onto the campus, submerged the track, breached the Bishop Moore Center for Excellence, and spilled into the parking lot. The deluge caused by Hurricane Ian toppled trees, damaged roofs, knocked out electricity and soaked classrooms.

Thomas Doyle, Bishop Moore's president, estimated Little Lake Fairview rose three to four feet. The persistent rain compounded the "unprecedented" calamity. He said staff is still assessing the damage. But in the midst of the drama, Doyle found a silver lining.



53.6% Central South






