

BISHOP'S LETTER: CCCF ANNUAL COLLECTION

My Sisters and Brothers in Christ:

Our Holy Father, Pope Francis, begins his apostolic letter marking the Sixth World Day of the Poor with the words of St. Paul to the Corinthians. "Jesus Christ ...for your sakes became poor." St. Paul spoke to the early Christians as he speaks to us through Jesus for all time reminding us that by our Catholic faith, we are compelled to live in solidarity with all God's people. Our Holy Father asks us to "reflect upon the many forms of poverty all around us."

It is fitting that we pray this Scripture as we take up the Annual Collection for Catholic Charities of Central Florida the weekend of November 19, 20. This important Collection is our prayer to God in thanksgiving for all we are given as we "keep our gaze fixed on Jesus" and offer our return to Him who became poor that we might become rich.

It was wonderful to see so many of you at the Diaconate Convocation on Saturday, October 22nd, at Holy Family Parish. Despite the change of date due to the hurricane, approximately 200 members of our diaconal community attended. We began with a beautiful Mass with Bishop Noonan, concelebrated by Father Martin, Father Shenoy, and Father Tom. Nineteen candidates received the Rite of Lector and we renewed our diaconal vows. In the morning, we were led on a guided reflection on the Path of Downward Mobility by Deacon Lucio Caruso from the Archdiocese of Louisville and capped off the day with a 90-minute afternoon session with Bishop Noonan. 

MINISTERING TO OUR CONGREGATIONS AFTER THE ELECTIONS

CONTINUING FORMATION – WEBINAR ON THE REVISED ORDER OF PENANCE



On October 25th, the Federation of Diocesan Liturgical Commissions (FDLC) hosted more than 1000 people on a webinar covering the ***Revised Order of Penance***. This webinar was co-sponsored by the Secretariat of the Bishops' Committee on Divine Worship. The new liturgy encourages parishes to hold more regular "penitential services" like we commonly do in Advent and Lent. Individual confession and absolution will still be the norm during those services. The present form of individual confessions separate from the communal rite will still be in use. In addition, the new Order of Penance includes a new formula for absolution and more dialogue between priest and penitent.
