




# FEBRUARY 24-26, 2023, FR. AUGUSTINE WETTA, OSB, "HOW THE DEACONS OF ORLANDO WILL (IN ALL HUMILITY) SAVE THE WORLD"

A deacon's life is all about serving with humility. Father Augustine will take us on the journey of how that humility, fueled by the Eucharist, and embracing inevitable moments of failure, will allow us to fulfill our mission of evangelizing the world ("Benedictine style").

Augustine Wetta is a monk of <u>Saint Louis Abbey</u> in Saint Louis Missouri. He has degrees in Theology, Ancient Mediterranean Civilizations and English. For 20 years he has taught English, Classics, and Theology at the Priory School, in Saint Louis, Missouri, where he also coached rugby and served as Director of Chaplaincy. He is the author of <u>HUMILITY RULES: SAINT BENEDICT'S TWELVE-STEP GUIDE TO GENUINE SELF-ESTEEM</u>, <u>THE EIGHTH ARROW</u>, a fantasy prison break set in Dante's Inferno, and <u>SAVING GRACE</u>, an illustrated children's book about a three-legged turtle. Father Augustine was born in Baton Rouge, Louisiana in 1971, but grew up in Galveston, Texas. There he learned to surf, and he remains an avid surfer. In fact, if you Google "surfing monk" his is the first name that comes up—along with a news report about how he was nearly eaten by a shark.

The Sacred Order of Deacons is permanently restored as a "living icon of Christ the Servant within the Church." The lives of the deacon and his wife are profoundly transformed by the diaconate and in their respective calls they become living icons of Christ the Servant. # SOUTH AFRICAN BISHOP SPEAKS OF IMPORTANCE OF PRIEST/DEACON PARTNERSHIPS

In a recent issue of The Deacon magazine Archbishop Buti Joseph Tlhagale of Johannesburg, South Africa shared important advice for priests and deacons attending his August General Meeting of Permanent Deacons for his Archdiocese.

"It is important that there be a good working relationship between the priest and the deacon. The two should develop a certain style of work, a working relationship, and a sharing of responsibilities." He further issued caution that they avoid "personality clashes." He encourage priests to "see a deacon as a collaborator, a fellow cleric. Pulling rank in the event of a misunderstanding should never be entertained." At the same time, he reminded deacons of our role to proclaim the Gospel, "the plan of God's salvation not only in words, but by example and personal testimony." He emphasized the deacons' roles to "to perform works of charity thereby becoming personal witnesses of Christ."

May we all heed Archbishop Tlhagale's wise counsel and dedicate ourselves to a deeper partnership with our priests so we can truly serve God's plan for salvation.






#### MEMORIAL MASS SCHEDULE
