REFLECTION ON THE IMPORTANCE OF DEACONS

Excerpted from comments by the Most Reverend Jerome E. Listecki ARCHBISHOP OF MILWAUKEE



I was privileged to address the Archdiocese of Milwaukee deacons. I began with the realization there are some things in my life that have always been a part of my experience. One is the television. I was born in 1949 and, as a child growing up, we always had a television in our home. This was not true for most of the homes in my neighborhood. It would not be until 1955 that half the homes in the United States would claim to have television. My father owned a tavern on the Southside of Chicago and had a 12-inch black-and-white television for his customers. There was not much to watch; wrestling was number one. In the early 1950s, Dave Garroway's Today show was extremely popular and thoughtful. It is hard for me to imagine that there was a time without television when families huddled around a radio and listened to their favorite programs. Although television has evolved through the decades, its purpose is still the same - the projection of images to entertain and/or inform. With the advent of the computer in the communication age, technology produced incredible advances. Many of these minor technological miracles today we take for granted. Today's generation wonders what it was like to watch a black and white screen with options of only three stations.

It also struck me that, as a bishop and priest, I have never experienced a Church without deacons. Although deacons had been a liturgical fixture for the celebration of Mass, the order of deacons had ceased to exist for hundreds of years. For the purposes of the Liturgy, priests assumed the role of the deacon. There are two most visible aspects of the effect of Vatican II – the liturgical reform experienced, especially in the use of the vernacular, and the restoration of the order of the diaconate.

I was ordained a priest in 1975, when the education and call of the diaconate was in its initial stages. I was assigned as a transitional deacon in 1974 to St. Michael Parish in Orland Park, Illinois, and already there were two permanent deacons who were part of the parish staff. I have experienced the tremendous support that deacons offer to the ministry of parish life. In my role as auxiliary bishop in Chicago, I could not have conducted effective ecclesial ministry without the work of the diaconate. In La Crosse, in addition to pastoral ministries, bishops and deacons assumed significant roles as directors of diocesan offices. Now, as Archbishop of Milwaukee, I could not imagine the proper functioning of our parishes and offices without deacons. I, the bishops, priests, and laity give thanks to God for their vocations. In the Acts of the Apostles in the New Testament, deacons are established to serve, reaching out in charity to LOVE ONE ANOTHER
