## **RETURNING TO MINISTRY TO THE SICK AND HOMEBOUND**

While there is a current and quite unfortunate rise in the number of COVID cases, it has been a positive development that most parishes have reestablished the practice of bringing Holy Communion to those in hospitals, nursing homes, and the homebound. Just a few reminders as we resume this important ministry.

- The Blessed Sacrament is always to be carried in a suitable pyx.
- Once the host is received, the minister should proceed immediately to the place where Holy Communion is to be distributed without delay.
- Holy Communion is to be distributed in the context of the Rite prescribed by the Church. In cases of pastoral necessity, reverent adaptations may be made.
- Holy Communion should never be offered to a person not in Communion with the Roman Catholic Church.
- Hosts should NEVER be left for consumption at a later time.
- Unused hosts should be reverently consumed by the minister or immediately returned to the tabernacle at the Church, if appropriate to do so.

As ordained ministers of the Church, it is our sacred responsibility to ensure the Body of Christ is always cared for with great reverence. Thank you for your loving ministry to the sick and homebound.

In a recent letter to the bishops in the United States, the leadership of Catholic Prison Ministries shared some powerful words. "Pope Francis reminds all of us of the importance of Catholic outreach to prisoners, who, even as they often are fulfilling a proper debt to society through incarceration, still need and deserve mercy-filled pastoral care. We write to you jointly today in the shared desire to ensure that Catholic spiritual and pastoral care are available to incarcerated citizens and immigrants in our country, and that the criminal justice system may become more permeated with what the USCCB, in its statement on crime and criminal justice named 'a Catholic ethic of responsibility, rehabilitation, and restoration.'"
