

Various Celebrations will occur throughout the year at the Vatican and in the Dioceses of the United States. Several aspects of the Bull refer to liturgy and are well worth noting – Mass preparations; baptismal fonts; indulgences; the Common Date of Easter (the East and West will celebrate on the same date in 2025); reconciliation and missionaries of mercy; and more. It does not appear that local dioceses should formally have a "Holy Door," but the Bull does encourage local pilgrimages to cathedrals and other sacred places.

New USA Edition of Holy Communion and Worship of the Eucharistic Mystery Outside of Mass

Hopefully many of you took advantage of the free FDLC webinar on the upcoming revision of the rites book for Holy Communion and Worship of the Eucharist outside of Mass. It was an excellent series that looked at the historical evolution of the worship of the Eucharist outside of Mass, including the theological principle that this rite must always derive its significance from and point back to the sacrifice of the Mass. It reviewed the minor changes to the rite, but perhaps more importantly, clarified a number of confusions regarding the best practices for both adoration and exposition. The new rite will be available from five major Catholic book publishers by August 1st of this year. The modified rite may be used by September 14th, the Exaltation of the Holy Cross, and must be used in all the dioceses of the United States by December 1st, the First Sunday of Advent. Please make sure that your parish orders a copy of this book this summer and the discussion of this rite may be an excellent topic of discussion for deanery meetings this summer and fall.
