EXTEND GOD'S MERCY IN ORDER TO PRAISE GOD

My Sisters and Brothers in Christ:

Within our faith, we associate freedom with the ability to love, as Moses and Jesus speak. Moses said to "return to the Lord with all your heart and all your soul." Jesus affirms what Moses said and clarifies even further when a scholar of the law said that to inherit eternal life, "You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your being, with all your strength, and with all your mind, and your neighbor as yourself" (Luke 10:27). These words may seem so simple. Jesus illumines the strength of God's Word when He says that loving God is more than being passive. As the scholar and Jesus discuss who is our neighbor and Jesus speaks about the Samaritan who ministers to an injured man on the road, while others pass him by, Jesus asks each one of us, who treated the man as a neighbor? The scholar replied, "The one who treated him with mercy." Jesus said to him, "Go and do likewise" (Luke 10:37).



DIACONATE FORMATION

We are pleased to announce 16 men successfully completed their formal discernment year and have been invited to begin their first year of aspirancy (the first of the five years of formation). They will be joined by a man who previously paused his first year for family reasons, so we will welcome 17 men and their wives into Cohort 2030. These men represent 16 different parishes in all six deaneries. Twelve of the 17 men are also bilingual in Spanish.

Rite of Candidacy for the 10 men in Cohort 2028 is August 9, 2025, at Sts. Peter and Paul Parish, Winter Park.

Rite of Acolyte for the nine candidates in Cohort 2026 is October 4, 2025, at Annunciation, Altamonte Springs during our convocation Mass. These men are entering their last year of formation before Ordination on June 6, 2026.

Please pray for these men and their families and those on the formation team.


BASILICA OF THE NATIONAL SHRINE OF MARY, QUEEN OF THE UNIVERSE

NEW MASS FORMULARY


FOR THE CARE OF CREATION

His Holiness, Pope Leo XIV has approved a new Mass formulary for the Roman Missal and ordered that it be promulgated. Missa pro Custodia Creationis ("For the Care of Creation") will be added as a Mass for Various Needs and Occasions.

In a July 3 press conference, Cardinal Michael Czerny, S.J. (Prefect of the Dicastery for the Promotion of Integral Human Development) and Msgr. Vittorio Francesco Viola, OFM (Secretary of the Dicastery for Divine Worship and Discipline of the Sacraments) announced the release of this addition to the Roman Missal. Cardinal Czerny spoke of the history behind and the rationale for the Mass formulary and Msgr. Viola walked through the texts and the readings. The Prefect of the DPIHD added that the Mass for the Care of Creation "calls us to be faithful stewards of what God has entrusted to us—in our daily choices and in public policy, as well as in prayer, worship, and the way we live in the world."

As is typical, the Mass texts have been released in Latin. Of course, it is the right and duty of episcopal conferences throughout the world to provide the official translation, but the DDWDS has released some working translations in order to make the work of translation easier.


FOR THE CARE OF CREATION

The Decree (Prot N. 283/24) "On the Formulary and Biblical Readings for the Mass for the Care of Creation" was signed by Cardinal Arthur Roche and issued on the solemnity of Pentecost, June 8, 2025. It noted, "At this time it is evident that the work of creation is seriously threatened because of the irresponsible use and abuse of the goods God has endowed to our care" (cf. Laudato si, n.2).

In the past several years, many ecumenical movements had sought a feast or solemnity or even a season in honor of creation. Pope Francis chose to encourage a Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation (September 1). Likewise, Pope Leo XIV encourages our participation in a World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation on September 1, 2025. Its theme is "Seeds of Peace and Hope."

By disseminating this new Mass formulary, the Holy Father recognizes that we might focus on this issue at other times of the year, when the liturgical day allows. "... [T]he Eucharist is also a source of light and motivation for our concerns for the environment, directing us to be stewards of all creation" (Decree, Cardinal Roche, quoting Laudato si, no. 236).

Pope Leo used the new formulary at a Mass at Castel Gandolfo on July 9, 2025. However, please wait for the official translation to be released by the USCCB before using it in the dioceses of the United States. As with all new additions to the Roman Missal, official Mass texts and appointed readings will be distributed to Bishops and posted on the USCCB website.


LEVEL UP YOUR FAITH

Saint John's School of Theology and Seminary in Collegeville, MN, is happy to announce our upcoming Fall 2025 event focusing on the theology of the permanent diaconate, the Nolan Lecture.

Formation for the permanent diaconate at Saint John's is rooted in the initial work of the United States Catholic Bishops on diaconal formation begun in the late 1960s. Father Kieran Nolan, OSB of Saint John's Abbey was a consultant for the U.S. bishops at that time on diaconal formation, and in 1969 brought back to Saint John's the initiative to begin a diaconal formation program there, one of the first in the nation. The Nolan Lecture for the theology of the permanent diaconate honors this historic legacy of diaconal formation and invites participants to a two-day symposium to pray, learn, reflect, and enjoy fellowship.

SPIRITUAL DIRECTOR TRAINING




