

God is constantly tapping us on the shoulder, letting us know He is actively engaged in our lives. Unfortunately, for a variety of reasons, many people do not recognize God's presence. That is where we come in – God needs storytellers! By virtue of our Baptism, we - all Christians – have an obligation to proclaim the Gospel. “Go into the whole world and proclaim the Gospel to every creature” (Mark 16:15).

**This retreat experience will explore our role as storytellers, answering questions such as:**

- What do we mean by storytelling?


# CARING FOR A DEACON AND HIS FAMILY AT THE TIME OF HIS DEATH

*"I have competed well; I have finished the race; I have kept the faith. From now on the crown of righteousness awaits me, which the Lord, the just judge, will award to me on that day, and not only to me, but to all who have longed for his appearance" – 2 Timothy 4:7-8.*

While we live our diaconal service faithfully here on earth, we know our eternal home is union with our Loving God in heaven. The Church in her love for her clergy has specific rites regarding the preparation for and funeral rites of deacons. The first step when a permanent deacon dies is to notify the Office of Permanent Deacons so we can support the parish and family in the necessary preparation of the rites. Our office will coordinate with the Bishop's Office and the Office of Worship to ensure all necessary support is provided to the parish and family. Some key considerations are listed below:

- **Deacon's Funeral Plan on File with the Diaconate Office:** All deacons are asked to have a funeral plan expressing their liturgical and other preferences on file with the Office of Permanent Deacons, as well as a copy with their parish and family. This helps the family and parish in making decisions consistent with the deacon's desires.
- **The Vesting of a Deacon:** A deacon should be vested prior to public viewing and the funeral rites. The Church provides a prayer ritual to be conducted as the deacon is vested at the funeral home. The vesting should be done by fellow clergy (deacons and/or priests). The rite may be found on **our diocesan website**.
- **The bishop (if available) traditionally presides at the funeral Mass of the deacon.** If he is not available, then he may designate it to the pastor of the deacon's parish or another priest, if desired by the family. It is expected that a cleric (priest or deacon) will give the homily. Care should be taken that the homily focuses on the promise of the Resurrection and not be a simple eulogy of the deceased deacon.
- **Deacons from throughout the diocese are invited to attend the funeral of their deceased brother.** The Office of Permanent Deacons will assist in the coordination of the funeral notice and will work with the parish to assure proper reserved seating for the vested deacons to sit as a college of deacons.

Together we give thanks to God for all our deacons who have faithfully served the People of God with the fullness of their lives.

# DIACONATE CONVOCATION

*Please mark your calendars now for our annual Diaconate Convocation on Saturday, October 3, 2026, at Holy Family Catholic Church. We are excited to announce that our convocation keynote speaker will be Sister Helen Prejean. Sister Helen Prejean is known around the world for her tireless work against the death penalty. She has been instrumental in sparking national dialogue on capital punishment and in shaping the Catholic Church's vigorous opposition to all executions.*

Born on April 21, 1939, in Baton Rouge, Louisiana, she joined the Sisters of St. Joseph in 1957. In 1982, Sister Prejean began corresponding with Patrick Sonnier, who had been sentenced to death for the murder of two teenagers. Two years later, when Patrick Sonnier was put to death in the electric chair, Sister Prejean was there to witness his execution. In the following months, she became spiritual advisor to another death row inmate, Robert Lee Willie, who was to meet the same fate as Sonnier.

After witnessing these executions, Sister Prejean realized that this lethal ritual would remain unchallenged unless its secrecy was stripped away, and so she sat down and wrote a book, *Dead Man Walking: An Eyewitness Account of the Death Penalty in the United States*. *Dead Man Walking* hit the shelves when national support for the death penalty was over 80% and, in Sister Prejean's native Louisiana, closer to 90%. The book ignited a national debate on capital punishment, and inspired an Academy Award winning movie, a play and an opera. Sister Prejean also embarked on a speaking tour that continues to this day. Over the decades, Sister Prejean has made personal approaches to two popes, Pope John Paul II and Pope Francis, urging them to establish the Catholic Church's position as unequivocally opposed to capital punishment under any circumstances. After Sister Prejean's urging, under Pope John Paul II the catechism was revised to strengthen the church's opposition to executions, although it allowed for a very few exceptions. Not long after meeting with Sister Prejean in August of 2018, Pope Francis announced new language of the Catholic Catechism which declares that the death penalty is inadmissible because it is an attack on the inviolability and dignity of the person, with no exceptions.

Although Sr. Prejean rarely addresses conferences in person, she has accepted our invitation to speak at our convocation, recognizing that Florida is 'ground zero' for the death penalty debate and knows the influence that the diaconate community (deacons and wives) can bring to this important issue. Don't miss this unique opportunity!


